Gas-containing spray can (aerosol)



Fuel

- Gasoline
- Kerosene
- Gas oil
- Charcoal, Activated carbon

Nail care products

Lighter, Match, Igniter

- Oil lighter
- Gas lighter

Battery

- Fuel cell
- Liquid battery (lead-acid battery, etc.)



- Lithium battery itself (including mobile battery)
- Products incorporating button-type lithium batteries (lithium metal content not more than 1g) can be accepted as non-dangerous goods.
- For SEA shipments, built-in batteries may be accepted as non-dangerous goods if they meet the above condition or if they are within 100Wh and up to 2 per box.



<Example of goods exceeding 100Wh>

- Electric assist bicycle (Nickel-metal hydride batteries can be accepted as non-dangerous goods.)



Liquor

- With alcohol content over 70% [Between 24% and 70%] Liquids in bottles of 5L or less can be accepted as non-dangerous goods. [24% or less] Can be accepted as non-dangerous goods.



Tank / cylinder, Gases

- Gas tank/cylinder
- Oxygen tank/cylinder (air tank/cylinder)
- Gas spring (for wheelchair)
- Fire extinguisher
- Helium gas
- CO2 cartridge
- Gas-type hair curler/Hair iron/Cartridges therefor
- Gas soldering iron



Explosives

- Firework
- Party cracker
- Smoke candle



Others

- Oil filled-type portable warm pad
- Smoke-type pesticide
- Heating agent for thermal lunch box/tumbler

For AIR

Lithium battery

- Product with lithium battery
- Both batteries themselves (alone) and built-in batteries are not acceptable.
- Products incorporating button-type lithium batteries (lithium metal content not more than 1g) can be accepted as non-dangerous goods. (e.g., rice cookers, weight scales and electronic thermometers are acceptable.)

A device body itself that is removed a lithium battery will be acceptable. For information on whether the removed a battery is handled as a carry-on or a check-in item, please ask the airline directly. Note: There are some products that a battery cannot be removed from products.

Home appliance

- Refrigerator
- Dehumidifier
- Air purifying device with dehumidifying function



Printing ink

- Over 500g ink /toner/cartridge
- Ink cartridges for home inkjet printers can also be transported by AIR.



Cleaning liquid

- Cleaning liquid (for contact lens/denture/wig/jewelry/glasses/shaves)



Hair care products

- Hair spray
- Hair tonic
- Hair growth formula
- Hair color
- Hair dye
- Hair bleach



Skin care products, Perfumes

- Skin lotion
- Face wash
- Sunscreen
- Sun oil
- Bathing agent
- Bath oil
- Mouthwash
- Perfume/Eau de cologne
- Aroma oil
- Milky lotions, serums and moisturizing creams containing sunscreen ingredients are categorized as dangerous goods by Air. Non-alcoholic skin lotions (toners) and face washes can be accepted as non-dangerous goods.



Daily necessities

- Home detergent
- Antiperspirant/Cooling/Cold spray (including for clothing)
- Bleach
- Strong mold remover
- Fragrance/Deodorant/Disinfectant/Wrinkle removal spray (for body/clothing/indoor)



Mercury

- Mercury barometer
- Mercury thermometer
- Clinical mercury thermometer



Medical supplies, Germicide, Insecticide

- Anti-inflammatory analgesic (liquid/spray)
- Germicide/Disinfectant (liquid/spray)
- Insect bite reliever/anti-itch medicine (liquid/spray)
- Insect repellent (liquid/spray)
- Insecticide



Others

- Magnet
- Speaker
- Light bulb
- Fluorescent light
- Ski/snowboard wax
- Wax remover
- Instant cooling pack



Some of the goods listed above may not contain components/ingredients of dangerous goods and may be handled as non-dangerous goods. Please directly check it through the manufacturer's website or customer service. If it is confirmed that the goods are non-dangerous goods, please notify our field staff or sales staff. Note: We cannot determine whether your goods are dangerous goods or not. Also, some items not listed above may not be able to be brought back to Japan due to regulations of the country of departure.

<Information on carry-on item or check-in item>

For information on carry-on item or check-in item, please directly ask the airline company you will use.

- Liquids Carry-on items must be put in each individual container of 100ml or less, and those containers must be packed in a plastic zipper bag of 1ℓ or less. For check-in items, up to 0.5ℓ or 0.5kg is accepted per container (Up to 2ℓ or 2kg in total: The total quantity of cosmetics, medical supplies, daily necessities, etc.).
- Lithium ion battery The main unit of the electronic device (with battery) can be handled as carry-on item or check-in item if it is 160Wh or less. As for spare battery (itself), it can be handled as carry-on item if it is 100Wh or less, while if it is between 100Wh and 160Wh, up to two can be brought in as carry-on item.
